Action	-Class I effect inhibits sodium channels
	-Class II effect inhibits Beta activity
	Class III (primary action) K channel blocking agent
	-Class IV effect inhibits CA
	-Slows conduction in the His-Purkinje system
	-Coronary and peripheral vasodilator
	-mild decrease in contractility
	-Suppresses SA node and slows AV conduction
Indications	-Atrial flutter with RVR
	-Atrial fibrillation with RVR
	-Atrial tachycardia
	-VF
	Pulseless VT
Contraindications	-Hypersensitivity
	-Sinus node dysfunction
	-Bradycardia
	-High grade blocks
Side effects	-Hypotension
	-HA
	-Nausea
	-Bradycardia
	-Parasthesias
Precautions	-May worsen or cause arryhtmias
Adult Dose	-Arrest: 300 mg IV; repeat at 3-5 min at 150 mg
	-Tachycardia: 150 mg over 10 minutes
Pediatric Dose	-Arrest: 5 mg / kg repeat at 3-5 minutes up to 3 doses
Route	-IV; IO
How supplied	-150 mg / 3 ml vials
	-150 / 3 ml injection
Onset / Duration	-Rapid / 7 to 50 days after DC
Half Life	-40-55 days
Interaction	-Antiarrhythmics: may increase effects
	-Beta blockers: may have additive effect
	-Digoxin may increase drug concentration and risk of toxicity
